"Through generous donations from the community and small businesses including pasta, diced tomatoes, to the Op Shop we are able to facilitate this much-needed service beans and many more to keep to those struggling in the area", volunteer co-ordinator for the Alpine Wilson, said..

"Whether it's because they can't afford to pay the high rents, are not getting enough hours at work or a number of other reasons, these people are doing it tough and come here to escape their cold cars and enjoy a bit of socialising."

As more and more people struggle Shop and Community Kitchen have to find accommodation or struggle to get enough hours at work to pay the rent, Jindabyne is seeing an increase of people sleeping in cars during each winter season and the volunteers want to do all they can to help those doing it tough.

Before each community meal the food bank in the hall is restocked with goods, volunteers purchase essential the number is expected to be much items so they can be supplied for free to those who are in need.

Non-perishable items are on offer muesli, cans of spaghetti and baked people fed this winter.
